Registration and Course Enrollment	
<p>1. Registration and Class: Starting on Monday, February 17, 2025.</p> <p>2. Course Enrollment Schedule and Information: https://course.ncku.edu.tw/course/.</p> <p>3. 3rd Stage of Course Enrollment: Online course enrollment: from February 13 to February 17, 2025. During this period, all students are allowed to add or drop courses online. Any enrolled courses dropped before the end of this stage will not be charged. Starting from February 25, 2025, students will be allowed only to withdraw from enrolled courses except for courses rearranged by the course-offering department/institute. Please refer to the Notice of Course Enrollment for the Spring Semester of the 2025 academic year for the latest information.</p> <p>4. Online Course Withdrawal Deadline: May 16, 2025. No refund will be made for course withdrawals, which will be recorded on the transcript.</p> <p>5. Deferral Students: Those who enroll in courses with 9 or fewer credits will pay course fees only. Otherwise, they must pay the full tuition.</p> <p>Notes:</p> <p>(1) Those who received integrated course credits for General Education through accreditation of the “Learning by Practice” courses will have to pay the full tuition if they enroll in courses with more than 9 credits.</p> <p>(2) Two-credit fees will be charged for a course of Physical Education or Military Training. A one-credit fee and a test fee of NT\$ 200 will be charged for a course of Remedial English.</p>	Registrar’s Division (50120)
Course Credit Waiver	
<p>The Course Credit Waiver System (https://nckustory.ncku.edu.tw/credit/index.php) will be open from February 1, 2025.</p> <p>Students who are eligible for the course credit waiver, as stated in Items 7 and 8 of Article 2 of the NCKU Course Credit Waiver Regulations, need to complete their application for this course credit waiver with relevant transcripts or credit certificates within one weeks from the start of class.</p>	Registrar’s Division (50120)
Study Suspension and Dismissal	
<p>1. Study Suspension for the 2025 Spring Semester: Please apply in person or by a deputy with power of attorney, with the required materials including the letter of parental consent (undergraduate students only), a self-addressed stamped envelope for registered mail with acknowledgement of receipt, and a completed application form. Application by POST will not be accepted.</p> <p>2. Tuition Refund: Those who have completed the application for study suspension or</p>	Registrar’s Division (50120)

<p>dismissal and paid the tuition can apply for a tuition refund. Please fill out the application form and enclose the payment receipt and a photocopy of your personal postal passbook for the refund. According to the related regulations established by the Ministry of Education (MOE), the tuition refund regulations are as follows:</p> <p>(1) Study Suspension or Dismissal Application Completed by February 17, 2025: No tuition will be charged. A full refund, except for the insurance fees, will be processed if a payment of tuition was made.</p> <p>(2) Study Suspension or Dismissal Application completed after February 17, 2025:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Two-thirds of the tuition will be refunded during February 18 to March 28, 2025. One-third of the tuition will be refunded during March 29 to May 9, 2025. None of the tuition will be refunded after May 10, 2025. Two-thirds of the tuition will be refunded for involuntary study suspensions (under the circumstances of students who fail to complete course enrollment by the deadline). 	
<p>Tuition and Miscellaneous Fees Payments</p>	
<p>*Our university has no longer issued any paper tuition billing statements. The tuition billing statements can be downloaded and printed from the Bank of Taiwan website at https://school.bot.com.tw/twbank.net/index.aspx. Tuition and fees information will be available at https://reg-acad.ncku.edu.tw/p/412-1041-5424.php?Lang=zh-tw</p> <p>1. Tuition billing statements can be downloaded and printed starting from February 5, 2025.</p> <p>You can make tuition payments in any of the following ways: (1) cash payment at any Bank of Taiwan branch, (2) cash payment at any Post Office branch, (3) ATM transfer or online ATM transfer, (4) Taiwan Pay, JKOPAY, and Line pay Money, (5) cash payment with a maximum limit of NT\$40,000 at any local convenient store, including Hi-Life, OK Mart, 7-ELEVEN and Family Mart, and (6) payment with credit card via internet or phone. Please note that the deadline for tuition payments will be Monday, February 17, 2025. All students, except for those with student loans or tuition waivers, must complete their payment by the specified deadline. Those who failed to complete this registration requirement will be dismissed from the university.</p> <p>2. Students deferring graduation and returning students will have to complete their course enrollments online according to the university course enrollment schedule. For those who haven't collect student ID card, please submit your application form and tuition receipt to the Registrar's Division after completing the course enrollment and tuition payment to collect student ID cards before February 17, 2025.</p> <p>3. The tuition payments for Foreign & Mainland Chinese graduate students who enrolled before September 2022 will continue to be charged based on two stages. The first stage involves the payment of the tuition as stated in Item 1 above. The second stage involves the course fees payment. These students can download and print their billing statements starting from March 26, 2025. Please be sure to complete this payment before April 13, 2025.</p> <p>4. <p>payments refunded in full.</p> <p>According to the NCKU Academic Regulations, students should complete the payments of various course credit fees after the end of the designated period for course enrollment addition and deletion. Those who fail to complete their payments of various course credit fees over two weeks after the designated deadline shall be suspended for the semester. In this case, those whose study duration has expired shall be dismissed.</p>	
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Required English Courses & Foreign Language Proficiency Requirements	
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<p>Required English Courses:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students (except for English majors) of the University must acquire 4 credits of English courses before graduation. Students are not allowed to take two English courses of the same title. 2. Students should take the courses from one of the three Modules according to their English proficiency levels. 3. NCKU English module courses with their CEFR alignments, please see https://flc.ncku.edu.tw/p/412-1144-21109.php?Lang=zh-tw 4. Freshmen (except for English majors) need to first take their English CEFR certificate/transcripts such as TOEFL iBT, TOEFL ITP, IELTS, TOEIC, Cambridge Main Suite to register for their English Modules, and then they can choose English courses via the Course Information & Enrollment system. <p>The Application for English Modules</p> <p style="color: red;">From March 17, 2025, to June 13, 2025, 9:10 AM to 5:00 PM.</p> <p>Please take the hard copy of your English certificate/transcript to the Foreign Language Center in person to register for your English module, so that you can choose English courses next semester.</p> <p style="color: red;">Note: Please take the hard copy. Images that show only fragments of the certificate/transcript or print-screened transcripts will NOT be accepted.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 5. Foreign students from countries where English is an official language, students who once received high school education where English is the instructional language for more than two years, or students who are eligible for credit exemption can apply for English credits exemption. For further information, please see “English Course Credit Exemptions.” 6. English majors do NOT need to take English courses offered by the Foreign Language Center. For other regulations, please see https://flc.ncku.edu.tw/p/412-1144-21109.php?Lang=zh-tw <p>Foreign Language Proficiency Requirements:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) All undergraduate students should fulfill the designated English or other foreign language(s) proficiency requirements before graduation. (2) Each department is responsible for verifying the qualification and documents concerning the required foreign language proficiency for international students from foreign language speaking countries. 	<p>English course Foreign Language Center (52273, 52258)</p>
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<p>(3) Students who have not successfully reached the required threshold may take Online Remedial English (a zero-credit, semester, optional course) or other courses specified by respective departments. Students who successfully pass the required courses are recognized as fulfilling the English proficiency requirements for graduation. The Notes for registering in Online Remedial English are specified separately.</p> <p>(4) Students who have reached the required graduation threshold of foreign language proficiency stipulated by their departments must register online themselves via the Confirmation of foreign language Competence System. An e-version of official grade report should be later verified by the students' departments and be submitted to the Division of Registrar. 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English Course Credit Exemptions

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Please check https://flc.ncku.edu.tw/p/412-1144-22834.php?Lang=en for the exemption standards and regulations. 2. There are Two PHASES of applications for credit exemptions. The qualifications are listed in the tables below. The credit exemptions will only be approved after the second phase of verification is done. No application is accepted later than the specified deadlines, except for special circumstances approved by the University. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) First Phase Application ONLINE: Applications for credit exemptions shall be completed online via the Confirmation of Foreign Language Competence System (https://eagle.english.ncku.edu.tw/) from February 1, 2025, to February 25, 2025, 9:10 AM to 5:00 PM. The wavier qualifications for students enrolled in/after the 2017-18 academic year differ from those for students enrolled in/before the 2016-17 academic year (especially for the scores on TOEFL iBT, TOEIC, and OOPT); therefore, choose the qualifications applicable to the academic year of your admission. Any untrue or insufficient applications require re-submission. Please remember to print out the application form after the application online. (2) Second Phase Verification by Foreign Language Center: A printout of the application form along with one of the following documents should both be submitted in person to the Foreign Language Center on the second floor of Hsiu-Chi Building on Kuang-fu Campus from February 17, 2025, to February 25, 2025, 9:10 AM to 5:00 PM. Please go to the Confirmation of Foreign Language Competence System (https://eagle.english.ncku.edu.tw/) to check the results of your credit exemption application after your submission to the Foreign Language Center: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. Valid passport (for those from countries where English is an official language). ii. Official transcript (or school letter) with a valid signature that describes the study period and subjects taught in English accounting for more than 50% of the entire subjects (for those who received high school education where English is the instructional language). iii. Original English proficiency certificate of GEPT, TOEFL iBT, IELTS, TOEIC, Cambridge Main Suite, BULATS, or Oxford Online Placement Test. 	<p>Foreign Language Center (52273)</p>
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<p>3. Those who have waived four credits and do not intend to take any English courses must drop the enrolled courses online before the end of the third stage enrollment period. The students who do not meet the criteria for credit exemptions or fail to adhere to the deadlines should take the courses as required. Students can apply for two- and four-credit waivers respectively only once before graduation. Maximally, only four credits can be exempted.</p> <p>4. The system for English credit exemptions will be open every semester. Students are only required to complete the application of English credit exemptions before graduation.</p>
